












Housing State Housing Coordinator: Kamal Bista

- Be proud of providing homes to those who were made homeless in their own home by getting market rent.








- Work to find solutions to challenges related to DV/IPV in refugee communities.





The purpose of the LOI is for applicants to briefly describe their organization and funding proposal and for the Kentucky Office for Refugees to review proposals and confirm eligibility before pushing applicants to the full application.

- Application Opens: January 2, 2025
- LOI Soft Deadline: January 17, 2025
- Applications Due: January 31, 2025
- Awards Announced: March 1, 2025
